















Year 4 Classroom



DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY - YEAR 9/10 3D GAME MAKER

For Digital Technology in Term 4, students in Year 9 and 10 are working on a program called 'Indie Game Maker' to develop the knowledge, understanding and skills to ensure that they are able to investigate, design, plan, manage, create and evaluate solutions though three phases: character creation, game designing and game development.

Game-based learning involves students using game development concepts and software to create their own games. Game making also helps students develop the three types of thinking that the Digital Technologies curriculum is based around, namely systems, design and computational thinking.

The students need to be creative, innovative and enterprising when using emerging technologies such as 'Indie Game Maker' and engage confidently and responsibly when selecting and manipulating appropriate technologies (i.e. materials, data, systems, components, tools and equipment).




HPV Vaccine




