Last week marks the end of the first week back for the Year 11 and 12 students. Thank you to these students who have transitioned back into normal school routines and work. We are fast approaching the end of Semester 2 assessment and planning for the second half of 2020 and beyond.

Year 10

Mr Pacey has handed out a quick questionnaire to the Year 10 students for them to indicate subjects that they are interested in for Year 11 and 12. We will be starting the Senior Education & Training Plans (SET Plan) process early next term. This is where students and parents are able to discuss choices for Senior Subjects in a SET Plan meeting. Information for students and parents will be sent home in the coming weeks.

Year 11

Assessment timelines may have changed for the Year 11 students due to the COVID-19 situation. Students will continue to learn all topics in each unit so that they will be ready for External Exams in 2021. Great work to students who have worked well during the switch to online learning and transitioned back to school this week.

Year 12

Assessment has changed for Year 12 students with one less assessment per subject this year. This does not mean that less topics will be covered especially because of External Exams happening in Term 4.

If you or your student has concerns with any of these changes, please contact the school as soon as possible so that we can ensure that they do not fall behind.

Vocational education and training (VET) courses are available to students while they are still at school.

VET is learning which is directly related to work. These nationally recognised qualifications are developed by industry to give students the knowledge and skills they need to work in a specialised jobs. At Burdekin Christian College these are being undertaken as part of our students' school studies.

It is vitally important that students enrolled in these courses (Engineering Pathways through TAFE, Sport and Recreation through Binnacle etc.) are completing their weekly set homework and online module activities.



Key points that need to be noted:

- You **MUST** attend class (even if they are online classrooms).
- Classes scheduled during periods of online learning will NOT be repeated face to face.
- You need to pass ALL competencies to complete a VET course.
- Many of the remaining competencies will be delivered via "Connect" (for TAFE) even though students have returned to normal classes.
- If you are having trouble, let your lecturer/teacher know and they will schedule a one on one tutorial session or "Connect" session (TAFE only) with you.

This is a difficult time and the transition to online learning was challenging, however many students are working hard and doing their best, and we look forward to seeing their learning progress as the year unfolds.


They will also be looking at significant beliefs, values

civilisation

and practices of Chinese society, the roles of key groups in ancient Chinese society, the role of a significant individual and how they have been perceived by contemporaries and later historians.

YEAR 8 – History – Medieval Europe

In this unit, students will be looking at the way of life in medieval Europe, focusing on key social, cultural, economic and political features. They will also be studying the roles and relationships of different groups, continuity and change in crime and punishment, and the important role of the Catholic Church and its dominance in medieval society.



Significant developments such as the Crusades and individuals such as Richard the Lionheart and Saladin will also be investigated.

HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES (HASS)

The humanities and social sciences are the study of human behaviour and interaction in social, cultural, environmental, economic and political contexts. The humanities and social sciences have a historical and contemporary focus, from personal to global contexts, and consider challenges for the future.

In Term 2, students will study the following key aspects:

YEAR 9 – History – Making a Nation

In this unit, students will be looking at reasons for the expansion of British settlement into Australia and the experiences of non-Europeans (including South Sea Islanders) in Australia prior to 1900. They will be investigating the living and working conditions around 1900, and how they were affected by the introduction of social legislation between 1901 and 1914.



YEAR 10 - History - Rights and freedoms

In this unit, students will be studying the origin and significance of human rights, as well as the background to the struggle of Aboriginal peoples and Torres Strait Islander peoples for rights and freedoms before 1965 (i.e. the causes, effects and significance of the Stolen Generations). They will be investigating the methods used by civil rights activists to achieve change for Aboriginal peoples and Torres Strait Islander peoples, and examine the significance of the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples to Aboriginal peoples and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

'Everyone is born with a measure of resiliency, and it can be nurtured or hindered by life situations'.



Resilience is a quality that helps us not only manage stress in our lives, but motivates and energizes us toward achieving our goals and living our dreams. It is the ability to 'bounce back' from difficult experiences. We can change the course for our children's lives and our own lives. Below are a few keys to foster resilience in all areas of life:

- 1. Teach them to nurture themselves: developing the practice of nurturing ourselves can keep our mind and body not only calm, but prepare us to deal with whatever situations come our way. We can teach our children how to have quiet 'me-time' without earbuds or technology, so they can learn to care for themselves well and learn to connect with their emotions.
- **2.** Encourage them to cultivate a positive view of themselves: developing confidence in our ability to solve problems and trusting our instincts helps build resilience. We can encourage our children in their ability to overcome, to solve problems and to figure things out without rushing to the rescue to figure out their problems for them.
- **3.** Help them learn to keep things in perspective: even when facing challenges or painful situations, trying to view them within the broader context of our life and our faith can help avoid blowing the event out of proportion and keep our focus on what we can control. Helping our children see the big picture is significant. When every problem seems catastrophic, life begins to feel overwhelming and outside of their control. Eventually, they simply give up.
- **4.** Show them how to maintain a hopeful outlook: having hope can change everything in life. Hope enables us to believe that good things will happen in our lives, to believe that God is at work, even in the midst of difficult circumstances. We can in still a hopeful outlook in our children by encouraging them to look beyond the immediate circumstances to discover the potential meaning or purpose in them.
- **5.** Model for them the importance of building relationships: relationships with close family members, friends or others are important. While we all need alone-time, we were intentionally created for connection, so it's important to not isolate from others. Accepting help and support from those who care about you and will listen to you strengthens resilience. Encourage your children to get involved in your church, school, and community. Learning to serve others develops their ability to see outside of themselves and nurtures empathy and compassion for others.
- **6.** Help them accept that change is a part of living: certain goals may not always be attainable as a result of adverse situations. We all have limitations and roadblocks, fair or not. Accepting circumstances that cannot be changed can help you focus on the steps you can alter and helps in looking for flexible alternatives.
- **7.** Empower them to move toward their goals: when life seems unfair and we feel stuck, that is a great time to identify small steps we can take towards a goal and move forward. When faced with challenges it can be easy to detach and wish them away. Instead, we can encourage our children that taking steps, even small ones will build forward momentum toward achieving their goals.
